a baby typically receives about 77 pounds of groceries, worth about \$125 if purchased from a large discount food store. This food costs the Mission about \$2 to give away. Not exactly a miracle, but a pretty good return on your investment, don't you think?

*Of the 4776 registered families, 64% are single mother families and 90% have less than \$800 monthly income. How would your family live on \$800 a month?


"All of the perishable food given away is donated. The Mission only pays for its storage, refrigeration, transportation and handling. The Mission also buys non-perishable food that cannot be sold retail.

"Your contribution also helps pay the salaries of 5 full time staff workers and other administration costs, like leaky roofs.

"So what does all this cost? About 3 cents per pound of food given away. In today's economy, that's a real bargain!
